Join the CAVS Summer Reading Club!!

All of our K-3rd grade students are challenged to keep reading this summer.

Here are the reading goals:

Kindergarteners going into 1st grade—3 books (Easy readers read with an adult)

1st graders going into 2nd grade—5 books that they should read independently

2nd graders going into 3rd grade—7 books

3rd graders going into 4th grade—**Read one chapter book from the list given by**
4th grade—PLUS—one additional chapter book of your child's choice

(Students going into 5th and 6th Grades will be given a recommended list of books.)

For students entering 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grades--There are no requirements regarding the kind of books they choose (reading level, type of book, specific titles, etc.).

For students entering 4th grade--One book should be read from the list provided by the 4th grade ELA teacher plus one additional chapter book.

(The second book can come from the list or be a book chosen by student.)

Students should record their book titles on the Reading Log on the back of this sheet. Keep the Reading Log in a safe place and return it to their new teacher by Friday, August 7. All students returning their Reading Log with the required number of books will receive a "Popsicle Ticket" for a popsicle at recess on Friday, August 14.

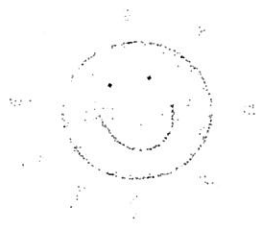
